CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) Application 2024-2025

BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S BRIEFING PAPER

ISSUE:

Staff is recommending the District submit a CDBG application to refurbish Water Tender 96. The CDBG application requires a Board resolution to authorize staff to execute and submit the application.

BACKGROUND:

The District has successfully submitted and completed several CDBG projects to refurbish water tenders over the last several years. The last project was the Water Tender 93 refurbish during the 2019-2020 CDBG.

DISCUSSION:

Staff anticipates that the Water Tender 96 Refurbish Project would cost approximately \$360,000 to complete. The District would be seeking \$300,000 from the CDBG and would need to fund the remaining \$60,000 from the District budget. A new water tender is estimated to cost over \$600,000.

ALTERNATIVES:

Not apply for the 2024-2025 CDBG and fund the entire project cost.

A RESOLUTION IDENTIFYING THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR FIRE DISTRICT RESPONSE TO INCIDENTS OUTSIDE OF FRESNO COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT JURISDICTION FOR DISTRICT COMPENSATION OR REIMBURSEMENT FOR SUCH RESPONSE

WHEREAS, the Fresno County Fire Protection District ("District") is an independent fire protection district in Fresno County, California, whose paid firefighters routinely respond to requests for assistance to incidents outside District jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, it is the Districts desire to provide fair and legal payment to all its employees for time worked; and

WHEREAS, the District has in its employ, fire department response personnel include: Paid Call Firefighter, Paid Call Firefighter Fire Apparatus Operator, Paid Call Firefighter Company Officer, Paid Call Firefighter Heavy Equipment Operator; and

WHEREAS, the District will compensate its employees portal to portal while in the course of the employment and way from their official duty station and assigned to an emergency incident, in support of an emergency incident, or pre-positioned for emergency response; and

WHEREAS, it is District policy that its Paid Call Firefighters are to be compensated as provided for by District Policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Fresno County Fire Protection District Board of Directors that:

1. When the District receives compensation and/or reimbursement for incident/event response through an agreement, including compensation and/or reimbursement it will be used for personnel compensation, equipment use, repair, and replacement, and allowable administrative costs as authorized by the agreement or applicable law.

- 2. Personnel shall be compensated according to an applicable Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), Personnel Rules and Regulations, and/or other District directives that identify personnel compensation in the workplace.
- 3. The District will maintain a current salary survey or acknowledgement of acceptance of the "base rate" on file with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Fire Rescue Division.
- 4. District will be compensated for all time committed in incident response, including the use of all District equipment apparatus, portal to portal, beginning at the time of dispatch to the return to the District location when equipment and personnel are in service and available for agency response.
- 5. District response personnel can include; Paid Call Firefighters, Paid Call Firefighter Fire Apparatus Operators, Paid Call Firefighter Company Officer, Paid Call Firefighter Heavy Equipment Operator, Heavy Fire Equipment Operator, Heavy Equipment Mechanic, Information Systems Analyst, Equipment Services Assistant, Fire Inspector, and Senior Fire Inspector.
